Latin America is a rich and diverse region, with a wide range of physical environments, climates, biological and mineral resources and a unique blend of peoples and cultures. This course is a general introduction to the geography, history and culture of Latin America. We will examine the physical environment, cultural traditions, lifestyles, economies, development and urban environment throughout the Latin American region.

Students will carry out an original investigation on a topic of their choice in their own time, this will be written up and handed in at the end of the course and each student will prepare a presentation of their project for the final class. During the course there will also be several assignments that consist of preparing presentations for a following class.

Course Objectives

- -Identify the major regions of Latin America and distinguish between them.
- -Become familiar with the physical features, climates and ecosystems of Latin America and identify these on maps.
- -Identify the countries of Middle and South America.
- -Understand the historical and social factors that contribute to the cultural diversity of Latin America.
- -Discuss contemporary environmental, social, health, economic and development issues and challenges in Latin America on a regional basis.
